Title/Subject: West Yorkshire Anti-Trafficking & Modern Slavery Network (WYATMSN) Coordinator Serial No: DP0052 (A) Summary: In 2014, PCC Mark Burns-Williamson secured funding from the Ministry of Justice and with the charity Hope for Justice set up the West Yorkshire Anti Trafficking and Modern Slavery Network (WYATMSN). The WYATMSN is coordinated by Hope for Justice and now in its fourth year of operation and continues to provide a strategic meeting framework on behalf of the statutory, non-statutory and third sector organisations in West Yorkshire who contribute to tackling human trafficking and modern slavery in all its forms. The Network operates at strategic and policy level, with each quarterly meeting being attended by representatives from organisations across West Yorkshire who work with or may come across victims of human trafficking. The network is currently under review and requires a dedicated part time coordinator to deliver the network aims and objectives and to help meet the demands on network members in this dynamic and evolving landscape of vulnerability and serious and organised crime. This will improve partnership working to effectively tackle human trafficking and modern slavery across West Yorkshire. Requested Decision: The PCC funds the post of WYATMSN coordinator within Hope For Justice until May 2020, at a total cost of £11,260
