I trust that you are satisfied with the way your request has been handled, however, I am attaching the OPCC appeal procedure should you wish to request an internal review.

Information relating to the claim, statement of grounds, defence (including summary grounds) and reply to the defence has not been disclosed because we consider that an exemption applies.

Section 17 of the FOIA requires a public authority relying on an exemption to:

- (a) State the fact.
- (b) Specify the exemption, and
- (c) State why the exemption applies.

The information that you have requested is exempt from disclosure by virtue of Section 32 'Information Contained in Court Records'.

Section 32 states that:

- 1. Information held by a public authority is exempt information if it is held only by virtue of being contained in:
 - (a) Any document filed with, or otherwise placed in custody of, a court for the purposes of proceedings in a particular cause or matter.
 - (b) Any document served upon, or by, a public authority for the purposes of proceedings in a particular cause or matter, or
 - (c) Any document created by
 - (i) A court, or
 - (ii) A member of the administrative staff of a court, for the purposes of proceedings in a particular cause or matter.

Section 32 applies to your request because the information you seek was created purely for the purposes of court proceedings.

Section 32 is an absolute exemption and does not require a public interest or prejudice test.
