Dear Minister

Further to your letter of 26 November 2014 in relation to my application for special grant funding to cover the additional costs of policing and English Defence League (EDL) demonstration in October 2013.

I would like to express my extreme disappointment with your decision not to provide a special grant as re-imbursement to West Yorkshire for policing the EDL demonstration.

Firstly, I am particularly disappointed that it has taken over a year for the decision to be made and communicated to me, despite regular and encouraging correspondence with both the Home Secretary and your staff, and every effort being made at this end to provide timely information to your office and HMIC who inspected the operation.

Secondly, whilst I acknowledge that the cost of the operation was less than 1% of the West Yorkshire Police budget, I do not accept that it does not present a serious financial or operational threat to the organisation. Given that the current budget gap is forecast to be over £162m by 2016/17, the organisation has necessarily had to shrink accordingly. The Force has suffered reductions of approximately 2,000 employees (officers and staff) since 2010/11. Coupled with other significant central demands on specialist policing from West Yorkshire, the NATO summit and the Commonwealth Games for example, both the Chief Constable and I are continually faced with ongoing challenges around the management of the remaining policing resources in order to provide an effective service to the communities of West Yorkshire.

I am deeply unhappy that each application for special grant is considered separately: West Yorkshire has recently policed two EDL demonstrations within a year of each other, the aggregate expenditure amounting to £1.005m equating to 0.25% of the overall budget. As such I would challenge the rationale behind the determination of the 1% guideline when taken on an individual event basis.

Thirdly, the special grant guidance makes it clear that the decision to fund expenditure of less than 1% of budget is at the minister's discretion. It would appear from information provided on your website (copy attached) that only one other decision has previously been taken to turn down special grant funding on the basis of the 1% budget guidance, and that a number of decisions to support additional funding have been made which amount to significantly less than the 1% criteria. From the information provided, there are noticeable inconsistencies in the application of the guidance which result in a process which is subjective. I am unhappy that West Yorkshire has been penalised on this basis.

In a time when funding is being severely reduced, and local areas are having to suffer increased top slicing for the IPCC, HMIC and the Home Office Innovation Fund, I feel the decision not to fund the EDL demonstration impacts significantly on policing in West Yorkshire, and on this basis would ask that you re-consider your decision.
